

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear donors, colleagues and friends:

The University System of Georgia Foundation can point with pride to a number of accomplishments in 2015. Yet one accomplishment remains a standout – the University System of Georgia Foundation has raised more than \$1 million in corporate sponsorships for need-based scholarships. These funds, combined with endowment dollars and careful stewardship of Foundation finances, allowed the Foundation to award and distribute an unprecedented \$1,024,800 in need-based scholarships for the 2015-16 academic year. I cannot thank our corporate and community supporters enough for your very generous and meaningful support.

Along with the important work of raising money for scholarships, the University System of Georgia Foundation also continued to support the University System through our work with the P3 housing project, professional development opportunities for the institutions' chief advancement officers, and the fiscal management of grants and charitable accounts. Detailed information on these activities is presented in the report.

In addition, this report provides highlights of the Regents' Scholarship Gala held at the College Football Hall of Fame in March. The evening paid tribute to our corporate supporters, faculty members, alumni, and the late Governor Carl Sanders who was a lifetime servant of Georgia and a leader in higher education. This annual event remains the primary fund-raiser for the Foundation, and it is the one time each year when corporate, academic and community leaders come together specifically to celebrate higher education in Georgia.

The University System of Georgia Foundation has accomplished a great deal this year. As a person who believes strongly in creating a "culture of philanthropy", it has been gratifying to me to serve as chair in a benchmark year for charitable giving and scholarship awards. It is with great honor that I share with you the University System of Georgia Foundation's Annual Report for 2015.



The USGF Real Estate Foundation

On October 15, 2008, the University System of Georgia Foundation, Inc. formed the USG Real Estate Foundation, LLC with the USG Foundation as the sole member. The USG Real Estate Foundation, LLC was formed for the purpose of constructing projects and renting the projects to colleges and universities within the University System of Georgia on real estate owned by the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia. Subsequently, USG Real Estate Foundation II, LLC and Real Estate Foundation III, LLC were formed for the same purpose.

In 2015, the USG Foundation voted to defease three properties at Georgia State University, College of Coastal Georgia and East Georgia State College as part of the P3 project with Corvias Campus Living.

The University System of Georgia Foundation, Inc.; the USG Real Estate Foundation I, LLC; the USG Real Estate Foundation II, LLC; and the Real state Foundation III, LLC collectively comprise the University System of Georgia Foundation, Inc. and Affiliates.

In 2014, the USG Foundation Board of Trustees adopted a new Strategic Plan that places a major focus on and a renewed commitment to raising funds for need-based scholarships.

USGF NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

\$900,000

Scholarships awarded to every USG institution for need-based scholarships in the amount of \$30,000.

ELEANOR BOYKIN DAVIS SCHOLARSHIPS

\$1.850

Need-based scholarships awarded to a student attending Armstrong State University.

Funding made possible through an endowed gift from Erroll and Elaine Davis.

MACON BIBB EARLY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

\$15,250

Scholarships awarded to former Macon Bibb Early College students attending a USG institution.

JAMES HULL NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

\$85,000

Scholarships in the amount of \$5,000 awarded to individual institutions for need-based aid.

EARLY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships awarded to 2015 Early College graduates. Funding made possible through designated contributions.

ELRIDGE MCMILLAN LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

\$15,000

FISCAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

PRIVATE GRANTS

The USG Foundation provides fiscal management for private grants administered by the USG Central Office in partnership with USG institutions and USG Education Agency partners. During FY 2015, these grants included:

Credit When Credit is Due Funder: The Lumina Foundation

Administered by the USG Office of Educational Access and Success to increase degree attainment in Georgia through policy changes and technical support to award reverse transfer Associate degrees.

Hispanic/Latino College Completion Funder: The Goizueta Foundation

Administered by USG Academic Affairs to improve access and success in higher education for Latinos/as in Georgia.

Multi-State New Models Engagement: Building Momentum

Funder: The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation

Administered by the USG Office of Educational Access and Success, the project convened senior academic leaders from ten state systems to establish relationships that would enable increased collaborative understanding of, and approaches to, rapidly emerging opportunities e.g. Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) and shared problem-solving and codevelopment of responses and policy.

Network to Transform Educator Preparation Funder: The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation

Administered by Council of Chief State School Officers in collaboration with the Georgia Department of Education, the Georgia Professional Standards Commission and the University System of Georgia to provide on-going support and continued coordination to advance the state's educator preparation transformation agenda.

Walk Georgia and Georgia Shape Funder: The Coca-Cola Company

Administered by the Department of Health and the University of Georgia this grant uses a two-pronged approach to address childhood obesity and encourage healthy lifestyles through preventive care, disease care, and early intervention.
